MAKE EVERY DAY COUNT!

Students with good attendance in elementary school are more likely to be successful in high school and college.

- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the year.
- Poor attendance can influence whether children can read proficiently by the end of third grade or held back.
- By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- Missing 18 days in a school year can negatively affect a student's academic performance. That is less than 2 absences a month!!!
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than students' 8th-grade test scores.
- Students can fall behind significantly if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
