Trustlands – pretty the same as last time. Still using the moneys that expire and soon will be taking from here.

- Cyndi would like a follow-up to knowing if chrome books can be bought in 6th grade. Does the committee has a voice in the decision or is it a district one?

Safe Routes –

- The grant from our first meeting is being used! They are moving forward on covering the canal and making a sidewalk (1300 W 13000 S or Cemetery Road)
- Brenda will go to meeting on Jan 22 – if we need to make an adjustment to the safe route, we can after that.
- A concern for Safety at some of the crossing guard spots = 13400 S and the cemetery Road at 1300 W ... there have been a couple of times without a crossing guard. What can we do to not have that happen?

Code of Conduct – This year we are staying as is with the code of conduct. Next year we will be using ways from “Hacking the System – Restorative Practices.” (unless we get more time at the end of the year to start implementing it) Are there books available for Cyndi and others to read if they want to?

School Fitness/Wellness Initiatives –

- Schools = healthier lunches with fruit/veg with every lunch.
- Rising New York Roadrunners = with P.E.
- Currently make a “social/emotional room”

Inside Days – 20 degrees & below we are inside or air quality that is bad. Committee was wondering about providing teaching with “options” since COVID restrictions of classroom games and activities. Jodi will reach out to PTA to see if teachers want extra activities and if room moms can coordinate that (like they did with the Halloween boxes). Maybe have boxes here for 15 days of activities after Winter Break. Parents are worried about “too much screen time” at recess time if inside.
