
If the open positions are NOT filled, we will hold another election in the fall.

PTA President's Message

Dear Parents,

We first want to say a huge THANK YOU for your support during Teacher Appreciation Week. Our teachers and staff were thrilled with the kind gestures, notes and gifts they received. As we wrap up the school year, it is always great to be able to give our teachers a much-needed boost! This year has been unusual, but we have been consistently impressed by the ability of our school administrators, teachers, and staff to make the best of difficult situations.

At the Utah PTA convention this week, the keynote speaker was Jennie Taylor, mother of 7 and wife of fallen soldier Brent Taylor. She spoke about her experiences with PTA. I hope her address will be made available for everyone to watch. It so perfectly captured the WHY of PTA. If you have ever wondered about why we need a PTA, here are three things she said that answer that question. First, she said that her experience with PTA started when she was in elementary school. She loved having her mom be in the classroom volunteering, but due to family circumstances, that wasn't always possible. She said, "When my mom couldn't be there, someone's mom was." That was PTA. Second, she spoke about her experiences as a PTA volunteer, and how at first she volunteered as a way to be involved in her own children's schooling, but as she volunteered, she realized that she was there not just for her own children, but for EVERY child, reading with them, cheering them on, listening to their stories, bringing a little extra joy into their day. When her husband was killed in action, she couldn't be involved in PTA the way she had been in the past, but she knew that someone else was there. Lastly, she spoke about the purpose of PTA. PTA is an association of parents and teachers who are bound together by the common interest of unlocking the full potential of each and every child in our school community. She highlighted exactly what I have loved about my own experiences with PTA. The association with parents and teachers who want to make a difference, and the association with hundreds of amazing kids who each have SO MUCH potential!

As a PTA, we are dedicated to serving our students by providing fun learning opportunities like funding for field trips, assemblies, and resources within the school like our outdoor classroom. We work to support our teachers and staff and cheer them on as they give so much of themselves to our students. Principal's Message

Dear Parents,

We are anxiously approaching the end to a unique school year at Riverton Elementary. I wish to thank all parents and students who have met this year "head on" and adapted to the unusual, yet essential, adjustments necessitated by a global pandemic. We hope to get back to a new normal next year.

Summer School

We are aware that COVID and quarantines have disrupted learning for many students. To respond to these unprecedented learning needs we are offering two sessions of summer school to students who demonstrate academic need in literacy. End of year Acadience (formerly DIBELS) testing for grades K-3 and Reading Inventory testing for grades 4-5 will be the measurement tools we will use to determine if a student is eligible for Summer School.

We have a limited number of teachers participating and this further limits the number of students we can serve. If we are unable to fill each session with students based on literacy needs, we will open the opportunity to other students throughout the school.

Sixth grade students will be able to attend summer school at the Middle School. Additional information will be provided at a later date.

Two sessions of summer school will be provided. Eligible students will attend one of the sessions.

Session I

June 7-June 17 (M-Th) 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon **Session II**June 21—July 1 (M-Th) 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon

Each session will be taught by certified teachers or aides (under the supervision of a certified teacher). The curriculum will be centered on Literacy supported with math, science, and social studies experiences. We want this opportunity to be fun and engaging!

Please note that crossing guards will not be available during the sessions of summer school. Lunch will not be provided.

Thank you!
