Dear Parents,

Walk to read is working!

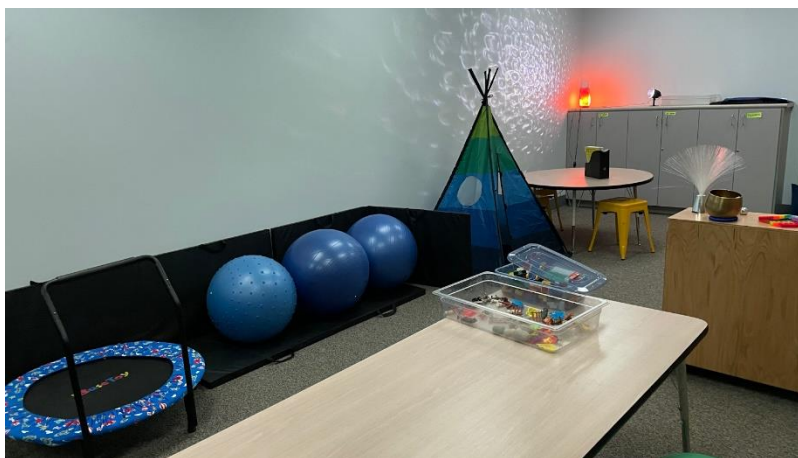
We recently reviewed growth data for all 6th grade students in reading. We wanted to know the percentage of students making typical or better progress from beginning of year to the middle of the year in reading. (Another way of stating this is: Is every child experiencing one year of growth for a year of schooling in reading?)

As of mid-year, 76.81% of our 6th graders are making typical or better growth in reading. This growth can be attributed to effective identification of specific skills needed and then providing targeted instruction to meet those needs. We are also extending instruction for those students who are already on or above grade level.

We are thrilled with this progress and look forward to seeing what the end of the school year brings in all grade levels.

Wellness
